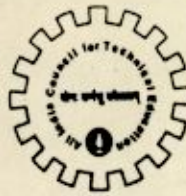

Sub: Approval to Lokmanya Tilak Education Society for establishment of Priyadarshini College of Engineering, Nagpur to conduct Degree Courses in Engineering.

Sir,

I am directed to state that on consideration of observations of Expert Committee which assessed the proposal of the College on 10.10.1992, recommendations made by the Western Regional Committee in its Meeting of 29.3.1993 and subsequent progress made by the Management in providing infrastructural facilities, the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has accorded approval for establishment of Priyadarshini College of Engineering at Nagpur by the Lokmanya Tilak Education Society to conduct 4-years Degree Courses in Engineering from the academic session 1993-94 with an annual intake as given below :

- Computer Engg.	90 (ninety)	—
- Electronics Engg.] - Electronics &] Telecommunication Engg.] - Industrial Electronics]	120 (one twenty)	The intake is to be re-allocated appropriately in Electronics Engg., Electronics & Tele-Communication Engg. and Industrial Electronics within the limit of 120.
- Mechanical Engg.] - Industrial Engg.]	90 (ninety)	The intake is to be re-allocated appropriately in Mechanical Engg. and Industrial Engg. within the limit of 90.

The above approval is subject to fulfilment of the following conditions :

1. The infrastructural and other facilities including equipment, faculty, books etc. should be provided as per the AICTE norms.
2. The Management should construct new buildings by June, 1994 on the acquired land providing built up areas in terms of class rooms, tutorial rooms, laboratories, workshop, residences, hostels etc. as per AICTE norms.

3. The Management should augment its faculty strength to 72 immediately by recruiting additional staff such as Professors, Asstt. Professors, Lecturers in the ratio of 1:2:4. The teaching faculty should be further increased to ultimate strength of 120 maintaining the cadre proportion as per AICTE norms.
4. The Management should augment its Administrative and Technical Supportive staff as per AICTE norms. ✓
5. The library holdings should be augmented by purchasing more text books, reference books, etc. as per AICTE norms. The Management should also subscribe to journals of Foreign and Indian origin as per AICTE norms. ✓
6. The Management/ College shall not make any request for increase in intake or introduction of new courses till the end by Eighth Five Year Plan.
7. No new course shall be started in the College without the prior approval of the AICTE.
8. The intake of these courses shall not be altered without the prior approval of the AICTE.
9. The AICTE scales of pay shall be introduced for the teaching staff.
10. The Management including the Governing Council of the College shall be constituted as per the AICTE guidelines and also the Chairman shall be appointed as per the AICTE guidelines.
11. The admissions shall be made on merit as per the guidelines issued by the AICTE and no capitation or donation of any kind shall be charged for admissions.
12. The tuition and other fees shall be charged as prescribed by the State Govt. within the overall criteria prescribed by the AICTE from time to time.
13. The teaching staff shall be recruited on an All India basis by open selection, and as per procedure, qualifications, experience, etc. as prescribed by the AICTE from time to time. State-based selection would be permissible for such posts for which the State Govt. prescribes "State-based selection" as a general policy.
14. The accounts of the College shall be audited by a Chartered Accountant and be open for inspection by the AICTE or anybody authorised by it.
15. The AICTE shall not give any grant or financial assistance of any kind.
16. The Management and the College shall follow any further conditions to be laid down by the AICTE from time to time.


This approval is further subject to full compliance with the SCHEME as prescribed by the Supreme Court in its judgement dated 4.2.1993 on WP(C) No. 607 of 1992 with other WPs in the case of Unnikrishnan, J.P. and others etc. etc. vs. State of Andhra Pradesh and others etc. etc. and the related guidelines and criteria as may be issued by the AICTE or the Central Govt. from time to time.

The College will be inspected by an Expert Committee of Western Regional Committee (WRC) by May, 1994 for reviewing the progress made in compliance with the above cited conditions.

In the event of non-compliance by the Management/ College with any of the above conditions of the AICTE, the AICTE will be free to take measures for withdrawal of its approval without consideration of any related issues and that all liabilities due to withdrawal of approval would be that of the Management/ College.

You are requested to kindly take necessary action in the matter and keep the Western Regional Committee (WRC) Bombay and the AICTE, Delhi informed of the progress made in this behalf.
