

## Flipped Classroom

A flipped classroom is a powerful teaching approach that enhances student engagement, fosters deeper understanding and makes learning more dynamic. it can significantly improve academic outcomes.

A Flipped Classroom is an instructional strategy where traditional teaching methods are reversed. Instead of lecturing in class and assignment, students also learn new concepts at home through videos, readings, or other resources uploaded on online medium so that all the student of that class can access the learning material and class time is used for discussions, problem-solving and hands-on activities.

- Active Learning Since students engage with new content before class, they already prepared to participate in a deeper sense of discussions and activities.
- Personalized Learning Students can learn at their own pace by pausing rewinding, or rewatching instructional videos.
- **Better Classroom Engagement** Teachers act as facilitators rather than lecturers, making classroom sessions more interactive.
- **Higher Retention and Understanding** Applying concepts in class helps students remember and understand the material better.
- More Student-Centered Learning Encourages students to take responsibility for their learning, developing critical thinking and problem-solving skills.
